He valiantly served our country during both World War II and the Korean War. During WWII he was the Executive Officer of the USS Segundo (SS-398) and served on all five of the sub's war patrols. He led a six man party responsible for boarding the Japanese submarine, the top secret, I-401, in Tokyo Bay at the end of WWII. He was awarded the Bronze Star for his efforts. The book "Operation Storm" details the submarine and the secrecy surrounding it for 40

years after the war.
